Jesus came to introduce a new covenant, a new command, and a new movement.

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment.

And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matthew 22:36-40

In the religious world that Jesus lived in, a person could claim to love God, and yet treat other people poorly. But Jesus proclaimed a new command to replace the old way.

Jesus changed the definition of neighbor to: Anyone, anywhere, with a _____ you can meet.

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

John 13:34–36

Jesus wasn't adding a third great command, but reducing the two down to one.

The gravitational pull of religion is toward rule keeping rather than relationship building.

The <u>old covenant</u> question: "What does the law require?"

Our <u>modern version</u> (but still old covenant): "What does the <u>Bible</u> require?"

The <u>new covenant</u> question: "What does love require of me?"

There's only one New Testament command: every other imperative is simply an <u>application</u> of the new command: "As I have loved you, so you must love one another."

Paul's applications of the new command:

Be kind and be compassionate to one another; forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

Ephesians 4:32

Love is patient, love is kind... it does not dishonor others... 1 Corinthians 13:4

In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

Philippians 2:5
