3 Seasons Of Life Preparation

• **Isolated**

Then the word of the Lord came to Elijah: "Leave here, turn eastward and hide in the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan."

1 Kings 17:2-3

Kerith = cut off (from the blessings) or cut down.

• **Total**

You will drink from the brook, and I have ordered the ravens to feed you there." So he did what the Lord had told him. He went to the Kerith Ravine, east of the Jordan, and stayed there. The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning and bread and meat in the evening, and he drank from the brook.

1 Kings 17:4-6

• **Unconditional**

Some time later the brook dried up because there had been no rain in the land. Then the word of the Lord came to him: "Go at once to Zarephath in the region of Sidon and stay there."

1 Kings 17:7-9

Discussion Questions

- 1) In 1 Kings 17:2-3, God led Elijah to a period of hiding in the Kerith Ravine. Kerith means "cut off or cut down." Describe a painful experience that God used to shape you into who you are today.
- 2) God taught Elijah to depend on Him daily for food and water. What are you trusting God for right now?
- 3) After the brook dried up, Elijah trusted God's word to move on to Zarephath. Is there a "dry brook" in your life God is using to lead you to take a step of faith? Explain.
